David Bloom is a veteran of thirteen startups, an advisor or director with four emerging companies, and a mentor for scores of innovative technology ventures in Life Science/Medical Devices, Advanced Materials/Cleantech, and Cloud/Mobile Applications.

David leads startups in Business Model and Customer Development, Translational Research/Commercialization, Revenue Generation, and Networking. He serves as coach and connector for Factotem's portfolio of companies, and as an operations leader in economic development and technology transfer programs.

David founded the <u>Factotem Constellation</u>, a global team of business formation and development professionals who provide hands-on engineering, marketing, and analyst/diligence services to entrepreneurs and investors. Prior to Factotem, David worked as a product developer, project manager, magazine writer, and editor.

David lectured at the University of Michigan's Ross Business School, and served as Course Operating Officer for its Financing Technology Commercialization accelerator practicum.
